

ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION BY ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 1982

1. GROWTH OF THE CLUB

Each year shows a growth of membership such that locations previously used for 'normal' dances, parties and socials are no longer suitable for holding these functions. A decision is necessary either to limit the membership to an agreed figure or to continue expansion utilising larger accomodations for functions at proable increased cost per member attending.

2. SPECIAL EVENT DANCES

Anniversary Dance, Pub Night, Fish & Chip Night, New Years.

Locations used for these events have a definite maximum number of attendees to give adequate space for dancing, etc. The 1981/82 executive therefore recommends the following:

- a. Only a definite number of tickets made available for each event.
- b. Approximately 1 month before the event, tickets would be available for members only.
- c. All unsold tickets would be made available for guests of members, non-members and memmers late in applying at the club Social immediately preceeding the event.
- d. Tickets could be reserved by members for pick-up and payment at the event but tickets must be picked up before the commencement of the event. It would be possible to arrange guaranteed late arrival.
- e. Where catering is involved, ticket sales must be cut-off 48 hours before the event, i.e. on the Thursday evening.
- f. Reserved tickets, not picked up before commencement, would be made available to non-ticket holders at the door.

3. FINANCES

The past yearhas shown that the club requires a standing account of a minimum \$2500.00 during the period 15 Nov to 15 Jan to cover payments made for the Christmas Party, New Years Dance, etc. It is recommended that a minimum standing account of \$2000.00 be required at the end of each fiscal year.

Little 'profit' is realised from the normal Saturday night dances with the Special Event dances adding considerably to club funds. The bulk of such profit, plus membership dues received, is expended on member-only events - Christmas and May parties - and continuance of this policy is recommended.
